**Study:** The Sanctuary (SY)

**Purpose:** To understand the various aspects of the plan of salvation through the symbolism of the sanctuary

**Center It:** God is love. Every symbol of the sanctuary pointed directly to Christ.



**Share it:**

1. **Exodus 25:8, 9:** Jesus wants to dwell, or “tabernacle”, with mankind. God is specific in the means – that is, he is providing a blueprint -- for connecting personally with humanity.
2. **Psalm 77:13:** The chasm between God and humanity is bridged by means of the sanctuary.
3. **John 14:6:** Jesus is the way, the truth, and the life. Thus He associates Himself with the sanctuary. *Point out the basic layout of the sanctuary . . .*
4. **Revelation 1:11-18:** A reference to Jesus in the context of the sanctuary. (*John 2:19; John 1:14*)
  - a. Jesus is clothed with linen down to the feet
  - b. Jesus is girded with a golden band
  - c. His head and hair are white like wool
  - d. His feet are as fine brass
  - e. Seven stars in His right hand
5. **John 16:28\*:** This passage summarizes the plan of salvation: Jesus came out from the Father into the world to save humanity and returned from whence He came – with the assurance that salvation was assured for those who accepted this wonderful gift.
6. **Hebrews 6:19, 20:** We have a hope as an anchor, both sure and steadfast, because the forerunner has entered behind the veil because He is the High Priest -- of the “order of Melchizedek.”

7. **John 10:9:** Jesus is the door.
8. **John 1:29:** Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! Jesus is the Lamb of God – signified by the lamb sacrificed upon the altar in the Jewish rituals.
9. **Titus 3:3-7:** Through the renewing of the Holy Spirit, we have become heirs of salvation . . .
10. **John 6:41-57:** Jesus is our sustenance; our spiritual nourishment – which we acquire through perusing the Scriptures.
11. **John 1:9:** Jesus illuminates every person by working in their lives. Every person is illuminated in the sense of the distinction between good and evil and a desire for self-fulfillment.
12. **Psalm 141:2:** Our prayers waft up to heaven as incense . . . The Holy Place represents a personal experience or engagement with God.
  - a. **Revelation 8:2-3:**
13. **Revelation 11:19; 12:17; 14:12:** Human beings are called to enter a relationship with God involving all of the symbols of the sanctuary . . . As the people who enter the relationship with the Creator, they are called to keep His commandments and uphold the faith of Jesus.
